Last week at Forever Angels, we celebrated our 18th birthday. The staff and children all celebrated with a nice meal, cake and soda.





Over the last 18 years, we have achieved so much and are thankful for your support and encouragement enabling us to provide lifesaving support to so many.

In the last 18 years have:

- * Given a safe, loving home to **472** children
- * Assisted in 213 children returning home to their biological families
- * Supported 154 adoptions
- * Set up **356** families with a sustainable business
- * Saved the lives of **691** babies through our Maisha Matters programme in Mwanza
- * Grown Maisha Matters across Tanzania to wonderful partners and between us have provided lifesaving milk to **2,339** orphaned or malnourished babies.

We think these statistics are something to smile and shout about on our 18th birthday!

Maisha Matters Expansion

We are so happy that Maisha Matters has grown again with a new programme opening at AAIDRO, St Elizabeth's Hospital in Arusha. The new team spent 10 days in Mwanza, learning on the job with our wonderful Forever Angels team.



We are excited to partner with a hospital for the first time and in just three weeks, they have already welcomed seven malnourished babies onto their programme. The total number of babies supported through Maisha Matters across Tanzania to date is 2,339! That's 2,339 babies who have been given lifesaving formula milk, whilst living at home with relatives and who never needed to enter an orphanage.

We love sharing our vision with likeminded NGOs and seeing this wonderful programme grow across Tanzania.

This little girl has been through so much in her 14 months of life. She was enrolled on our Maisha Matters for many months, but she was not doing well and Social Welfare placed her at Forever Angels in a very fragile condition. She really struggled to gain weight for many months, but Doctors did not find any reason. Finally, the last couple of months, she has been doing so well - gaining weight, smiling and starting to play.

We are devastated to lose this beautiful little girl, but we take some comfort knowing she was so loved in Chui House at Forever Angels in the final months of her life.

Zawadi - Coming Full Circle

Last month we were thrilled to have Zawadi volunteering with us. Zawadi lived at Forever Angels herself for around five years as a young child. She was adopted when she was 7 and she now lives in America and has just graduated from High School. It was so wonderful to have her back at Forever Angels - now as a volunteer!
